

FEMA Instructor-Led Courses (Pre-approved for CECs)

Each of the following FEMA instructor-led courses have been pre-approved for Continuing Education Credits (CECs) as of 3/9/2017. To be eligible to obtain CECs for any of these courses, the CFM must provide proof of successful completion of the course. Courses may become unavailable due to revisions, retirement, etc. If you completed the course prior to inactivation you *may* be eligible for the CECs approved below. If your course completion certificate indicates a different duration than what is listed below, CECs will be assessed based on the duration listed on your certificate up to 12 CECs. **NOTE: Courses are eligible for the CECs approved below if the course number, title, duration, and CEUs, match those listed below- any variation requires that the course be re-evaluated for credit before CECs can be given.**

FEMA courses are letter-coded to indicate the delivery format and location of the course.

- "E" courses are held face-to-face on the EMI campus. Any "E" course pre-approved for CECs being held as an "L" course will be awarded the same CECs as the "E" version.
- "L" courses are held face-to-face at a location outside of EMI with a FEMA employee present for the delivery, and may vary content/duration of the course by 10% from the "E" curriculum. Any "E" course pre-approved for CECs being held as an "L" course will be awarded the same CECs as the "E" version.
- "G" courses are held face-to-face at a location outside of EMI by a state/local/tribal/chapter without FEMA staff present, and may vary content/duration of the curriculum however they choose. "G" courses may be eligible for CECs, but are not included on this pre-approved course list due to the flexible nature of the course delivery. All "G" course deliveries must be submitted individually to ASFPM for CEC assignment each time they are offered.
- "V" courses are instructor led, live courses being held via video teleconference.
- "IS" courses are independent study courses held online without a live instructor and are self-paced, self-directed courses.

APPLY TO ATTEND

Courses are offered free-of-charge to those who qualify for enrollment. FEMA provides free accommodations on the EMI campus and travel reimbursement for local/state/tribal government employees who are accepted to attend courses on the EMI campus (E courses). State and local participants must submit their application through the State Emerg. Mgmt. Training office. Tribal representatives can submit application directly to NETC Admission Office.
