- 2D BLE discussion - concerns with utilizing 2D models for future phases and the regulatory phase of map adoption. Regulatory issues associated with ensuring encroachments do not have adverse impacts are related to loss of conveyance. Loss of conveyance is analyzed using a 1D model.
- Kentucky and Colorado are doing 2D BLE and should touch base with David Knipe who is developing a white paper on this topic.
- CTP 5 Year Plan - Mentoring plan
 - Discussed training versus mentoring and avoiding focused topics if it's mentoring. Examples are CNMS & LOMR delegation – CNMS issues could be addressed with training whereas the latter would be a good opportunity to mentor.
- CTP survey
 - Discussed incorporating 1-2 questions for CTPs to answer after webinar sessions since they are answering questions anyway and to keep it simple for better response.
 - Suggested questions we have talked about previously include:
 - Can CTP's provide a link to their website?
 - Can CTP's provide a newsletter or article that they have developed on their program?
 - Can CTP's provide a copy of their most recent State Business Plan?
 - Federal versus non federal funding spent on mapping projects
 - Technical work done in house or contracted out
 - Do CTP's have a best practice tool they are willing to share?
 - What is CTP's highest priority?
- CTP webpage on the ASFPM website - For now we should add CTP monthly call notes on the website as well as some links to reports associated with past CTP projects.
- Next webinar was to be USGS inundation
 - Thuy will reach out to her USGS contact, who is currently finishing up their inundation work for the State. If he is unable or does not respond within a week, will notify Carey for him to reach out to his contact

- CTP Best Practice - our subcommittee will look for focused BP related to how CTP's bring value to the program specifically. This will reduce redundancy in the BP solicitations coming from other groups
